The Paul White Memorial Road Race Set for Saturday, July 8

he 2023 Paul White Road Race - NFVA's annual 4.81-mile run through the village of North

Falmouth - will take place July 8th starting at 9 a.m. Sanctioned by USA Track & Field, the race begins and ends on Chester Street between the North Falmouth Library and Megansett Park - site of the market owned for many years by the race's namesake and his wife, Audrey.

Last year's race drew more than 200 participants, and race director, Ron Chapman, expects a similarly enthusiastic response this year.

The registration fee is \$25 (\$30 on the day of the race). Proceeds support the North Falmouth Village Association's non-profit efforts, which include social & educational group activities, maintaining the Junction building, and scholarships for graduating North Falmouth students.

To commemorate this festive weekend, **Road Race T-shirts** will again be available for purchase. A table will be set up both on race day and during Village Unplugged.

Preparing for Porchfest: New Acts in the Lineup

The lineup is shaping up for the **2023 North Falmouth Porchfest**, which will take place **Sept. 23** along Old Main Road (**rain date Sept. 24**). A few of last year's favorites will be returning (**Grasshopper Green**, **Puffy Elvis**), along with some new names:

Wendy Lucas is a Portuguese-American singer/songwriter, multi-instrumentalist, and performer who began singing at the age of eight in church. Her influences include H.E.R., Daniel Caesar, Kehlani, and Alicia Keys, and her style is guided by artists such as the Beatles, Billie Eilish, John Mayer, and Vulfpeck.

Mwalim DaPhunkee Professor (Morgan James Peters) is a multi-award-winning composer, musician, theater artist, writer, and educator. A three-time winner of the New England Urban Music Award for Jazz, he is also the writer and co-producer of The GroovaLottos' six-time Grammy-nominated album Ask Yo' Mama.

ZYG 808 (pronounced Zee Why Gee Eight-0h-Eight) is a "Soul Poet" musician, composer, producer, vocalist, DJ, and recording artist of Afrobeat, Rare Groove/Funk, Hyper Pop, and Hip-Hop. A leading figure in the Thump & Soul music movement, he is also the drummer of the soul-funk jam band The GroovaLottos.

Bird at Sea is the alt/indie duo of songwriters Sierra Partlan (vocal, piano) and Andrew Aghababian (guitar). They have been performing together in various configurations for over a decade. Their music has been described as soulful and inventive.

NFVA 2023 Scholarship Winners

The North Falmouth Village Association has awarded \$1,000 college scholarships to four village students who graduated this year from Falmouth High School. Every year, the NFVA awards these four scholarships to graduating North Falmouth residents. The awards are based on academic achievement, school and local activities, and overall service to the community. Applications typically open at the beginning of the calendar year.



Josephine Oberton, a graduate of Falmouth High School, participated in many activities, including running track and cross-country (she was an All League Honorable Mention for cross-country in 2022). She also was a member of both the National Honor and Math Honor societies. She served as a camp counselor for Camp Invention at North Falmouth Elementary School and as a French Club student teacher at Morse Pond School. She'll now study communicative disorders at Gordon College in Wenham, Massachusetts, with the goal of becoming a speech-language pathologist. "My ultimate goal is to support children and families...giving those children the opportunity to speak and communicate," she says.

Emily Allen, a graduate of Falmouth High School, was a member of the National Honor Society and the Spanish Honor Society (for which she served as president in 2022-23) as well as a Peer Mentor for English Language Development (ELD) students. She will now pursue a degree in biology at the University of Massachusetts Amherst (she'd like to double major in Spanish or Latin American studies) with the goal of becoming a doctor or physician's assistant. She says she would also like to study abroad, "traveling and immersing myself in the beautiful cultures of the world," and someday work with an organization such as Doctors without Borders.



Lucy Armour, a graduate of Falmouth High School, was on the National Honor Society, served as a 2023 class representative, and played on the school's lacrosse, girls hockey, and field hockey teams (she was a Cape and Islands All Star in girls hockey in 2022-23). She also volunteered for local organizations ranging from the Falmouth Road Race to Tommy's Place, the local nonprofit that provides vacations for kids with cancer. She'll now pursue a degree in elementary education at New England College in New Hampshire. Ultimately she would like to return to North Falmouth to teach and coach at North Falmouth Elementary School.



Shannon Keating, a graduate of Sturgis Charter Public School who also studied in the International Baccalaureate Program. She served as captain of Sturgis' varsity field hockey and varsity softball teams, was a Key Club member, and achieved High Honors recognition annually. She also founded the Happy Hope Club, which made up care packages for those in need (e.g., pediatric cancer patients, the homeless). Given her professed love of science and fascination with the brain, she plans to study neuroscience at American University in Washington, DC. She says she'd also like to study international relations to "have a greater impact on the world."




